# Getting Started with the Job Hunt Worksheet 

How to narrow the field of potential jobs to find the best work environment for you.

1. Brainstorm. Decide what characteristics you want in a job, including the hours and days desired, as well as job responsibilities.
a. What kinds of THINGS do you want to do while at work? List all the characteristics, responsibilities, and activities associated with that career:
b. How important is it to you that your work has a lot of variety? Consider your personal need for variety and list the types of jobs you imagine have that level of variation here:
c. The lower the entry-level position, the more supervision you will experience and the less amount of autonomy (personal choice). Consider your need for autonomy and list the types of jobs you imagine have that level of personal choice here:
d. How important is the social significance of your work? Consider your own values and decide if you need to alter you job search to account for what is important to you:
e. How much training are you willing to accept in order to become job-ready? Put your answer in terms of days or weeks:
f. What entry-level, paid, or unpaid internships relate to your ultimate goal? List them all here:
g. Scheduling. Note when you WANT to work and when you actually CAN work. Be realistic.
2. Refine your list. Figure out where you can compromise. Consider each of the value statements in \#1 and note each potential compromise you might make here:
3. Eliminate impossibilities. Take every job or job responsibility you noted in \#1 and put it into one of two columns: Possible or Impossible
